RESEARCH INTERESTS

As a cultural oncologist, my research is grounded in intersectionality, cancer diagnosis and treatment, and social justice. I focus on the body from a cultural perspective, maintaining particular attention to how sex, race, gender, and sexuality are inscribed on bodies, attaching cultural meanings that are used to include or exclude particular people from specific social settings, such as medical clinics. I am focused on breast cancer disparities, and am split across the Department of Epidemiology and the Sidney Kimmel Comprehensive Cancer Center at Johns Hopkins University. My PhD was earned under the guidance of Patricia Hill Collins (from the Department of Sociology), a leading authority on intersectionality and Black feminist social theories.
