I am a medical sociologist focused on ending disparities based on sexual orientation, gender expression, and race in access to and uptake of clinical cancer care. I maintain particular attention on how sex, race, gender expression, and sexuality are inscribed on the body, attaching cultural meanings that are used to include or exclude particular people from specific social settings. My interdisciplinary research approach to understand the effects of how people are read in society and the power exerted on people to keep them legible within social categories is strengthened by extensive training in qualitative ethnographic methods and intersectionality.
